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9 **STUDENT WITHDRAWAL (SEMESTER/BLOCK) 7th - 12th GRADES**

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11 Mountain Home School District No. 193 (MHSD) will follow this procedure regarding early
12 withdrawal of students grades 7-12.

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14 If a MHHS and MHJH student, especially those students who are in jeopardy of losing credits,
15 withdraws from school ten (10) to nineteen (19) days before the end of semester, the student will
16 need administrative approval for early completion of the semester and must complete and pass the
17 final semester examination to receive credit for the course(s).

18
19 If a BMHS student, especially those students who are in jeopardy of losing credits, withdraws from
20 school five (5) to nine (9) days before the end of the **semester block**, the student will need
21 administrative approval for early completion of the **semester block** and must complete and pass
22 the final block examination to receive credit for the course(s).

23
24 If a MHHS and MHJH student withdraws from school twenty (20) days before the end of semester,
25 the student will not receive credit for the course(s).

26
27 If a BMHS student withdraws from school ten (10) days before the end of the **semester block**, the
28 student will not receive credit for the course(s).

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30 **MILITARY STUDENTS** (I.C. 33-5701)

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32 **ARTICLE VII (of I.C. 33-5701)**

34 In order to facilitate the on-time graduation of children of our military families, Mountain Home
35 School District No. 193 (MHSD) will incorporate the following procedures for students of military
36 families:

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38 A. Waiver Requirements – administrators shall waive specific courses required for graduation
39 if similar coursework has been satisfactorily completed in another school district or shall
40 provide reasonable justification for denial. Should a waiver not be granted to a student who
41 would qualify to graduate from the sending school district, MHSD shall provide an
42 alternative means of acquiring required coursework so that the graduation may occur on
43 time.

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45 B. Exit Exams – in accordance with Idaho Code, the state of Idaho and the MHSD shall
46 accept: 1) exit or end-of-course exams required for graduation from the sending
47 state/school; or 2) national norm-referenced achievement tests; or 3) alternative testing, in
48 lieu of testing requirements for graduation in the receiving state. In the event the above
49 alternatives cannot be accommodated by the receiving state for a student transferring in his
50 or her senior year, then the provisions of Article VII, Section C, shall apply as follows.

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52 C. Transfers During Senior Year – Should a military student transferring at the beginning or
53 during his or her senior year be ineligible to graduate from the receiving local education
54 agency after all alternatives have been considered, the sending and receiving local
55 education agencies shall ensure the receipt of a diploma from the sending local education
56 agency, if the student meets the graduation requirements of the sending local education
57 agency. In the event that one (1) of the states in question is not a member of this compact,
58 the member state shall use best efforts to facilitate the on-time graduation of the student in
59 accordance with sections A. and B. of this article.
