<p>Category 1: Low Community Spread</p> <p>Evidence of isolated cases or limited transmission, case investigations underway, no evidence of exposure in a large communal setting, e.g. healthcare facility, school, mass gathering</p>	<p>Category 2: Minimal to Moderate Community Transmission</p> <p>Widespread and/or substantial transmission with high likelihood of confirmed exposure within communal settings, with potential for rapid increase in suspected cases.</p>	<p>Category 3: - Extensive Community Spread: School Closures and On-Line Learning</p> <p>Large scale community transmission, healthcare staffing significantly impacted, multiple cases within communal settings like healthcare facilities, schools, and mass gatherings.</p>

In the Classroom:



The following are guidelines to help continue to keep our students safe:

- Safe individual workspaces will be created within the classroom.
- Students will be provided with and expected to use their own supplies.
- Student movement among the building will be kept to a minimum. Computers & Library will be conducted in the classroom. PE will be conducted outside as weather permits and moved into the gym as needed. Music will be conducted in the gym.
- Masks will be worn by all students and staff.
- Hand sanitizer stations will be in all classrooms.
- Water bottles will be allowed in the classrooms.
- No outside food in the classrooms, except for lunch items (ie-birthday and celebration treats).

The following are guidelines to help continue to keep our students safe:

- Students will be divided into morning (8:30-11:15) and afternoon (12:15-3:00) groups Mondays-Thursdays, and online Fridays.
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- Students will be provided with and expected to use their own supplies.
- Student movement among the building will be kept to a minimum. Computers & Library will be conducted in the classroom. PE will be conducted outside as weather permits and moved into the gym as needed. Music will be conducted in the gym.
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- No outside food in the classrooms (ie-birthday and celebration treats).

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Community Areas (Playgrounds, Lunchrooms, Gyms, Before & After School):



The following are guidelines to help continue to keep our students safe:

- Teach and follow set traffic patterns and procedures entering and exiting.
- Consider schedule changes and set markings to limit student gatherings.
- Masks will be worn by all students and staff.
- Procedures for picking up students early and drop off or delivery of items: 1. Parents will call from the car, give verbal permission for student to leave school. 2. Parent will walk to the front door of the school and office staff will walk student to the front door for visual confirmation of pick up.
 - If parents are dropping an item off for a student, they will set it on the table outside the front doors and call the office to make them aware of the item.

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Mountain Home School District Online hosted by the Idaho Digital Learning Academy

The Mountain Home School District is aware some students and families may wish to continue their education in an online environment. MHSDO will offer a full online option for students. All students at MHSD Online (MHSDO) will be provided with a Mountain Home School District device. Students who need internet access may also apply to receive a district issued hotspot to be used to access educational content.

At the elementary level, students will be taught the same subjects and standards as are taught in our traditional brick and mortar elementary schools. Teachers will collect work and provide feedback and assessments and assignments will be graded. Group discussions will be part of the school day. These classes are not operated the same as during our remote learning last spring. The classes are based on IDLA instruction, rigor, and accountability. The curriculum may be different than used in our on-site instruction. All classes teach Idaho contented standards for each subject.
